On April 30, 2010, Blue Mountain Broadcasting filed a Petition for Reconsideration requesting reconsideration of the Forfeiture Order issued by the Video Division (“Division”).¹ This letter is to inform you that the Division is not planning to take further action relating to this matter. You should not construe the closing of the proceeding as a determination that the forfeiture has been rescinded or that a violation did not occur. The Division will not hesitate to take action against the Licensee for violations, including those of a similar nature, which occur in the future.
