Dear Mr. Davis:

This is in reference to the request filed on May 13, 2015. CCL requests a further extension of the STA granted on June 29, 2006, to operate Station WSYR with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits due to a series of antenna system repairs.¹ In support of the request, CCL states that in the past six month STA period it was unable to complete all nighttime pattern adjustments and measurements due to winter weather delays, yet the daytime pattern remains in substantial adjustment.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the request for extension of the STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WSYR(AM) may continue to operate with parameters at variance from licensed values and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits. It will be necessary to

further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. CCL must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310. We anticipate that CCL will complete all work on the nighttime pattern and file an acceptable FCC Form 302 application well before the expiration date shown below (as required due to the numerous repairs done over the past nine years) so that a new updated license can be granted before winter conditions arrive again.

This authority expires on December 1, 2015.
