This letter is in reference to your attorney's letter dated January 26, 1999 requesting Special Temporary Authority (STA) to operate KCHR with licensed facilities authorized in BLH-851115KB except with an effective radiated power at less than 90 percent. This operation is being conducted at the Commission's request in order to obviate any question regarding KCFR's compliance with the RF radiation rules at particular locations near its transmitter. This STA is necessary pending the relocation of KCFR's transmission plant.

Dear Ms. Salas:

On behalf of Public Broadcasting of Colorado, Inc. ("Colorado Public Radio" or "CPR"), licensee of noncommercial Station KCFR, Denver, Colorado, this is to request special temporary authority to operate Station KCFR at less than 90 percent of its authorized effective radiated power ("ERP") for a period of six months from the date of action on this request. In support, we submit the following:

CPR previously notified the Commission that KCFR currently is operating at 85 percent of its authorized ERP. This operation is being conducted at Commission request in order to obviate any question regarding KCFR's compliance with the RF radiation rules at particular locations near its transmitter.

Based upon the foregoing, CPR respectfully requests that the Commission grant it special temporary authority to operate KCFR at less than 90 percent of authorized ERP. STA is necessary pending the relocation of KCFR's transmission plant. (Relocation will be required due to the planned movement of KRMA-TV, the owner of the tower on which KCFR's antenna is mounted, to new DTV facilities.)

Enclosed herewith, in support of this request, is a certification signed by Ms. Jenny Gentry, Vice-President, Finance and Administration, regarding CPR's compliance with Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988. CPR is a non-profit entity and operates KCFR on a noncommercial basis. Therefore, no filing fee is required for this request.
