Dear Ms. Kramar:

This is in reference to the request filed on July 7, 2015. MMS requests a final extension of the STA originally granted on January 28, 2010, to operate Station KWRM(AM) with emergency antenna facilities (and modified to allow operation with parameters at variance) due to collapse of a tower and other repairs. In support of the request, MMS states that it has now filed an FCC Form 302 application (BL-20150625ACN) with a partial proof to update all operating parameters.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

¹ KWRM(AM) is licensed for DA operation on 1370 kHz with 5 kW day and 2.5 kW night.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED and station KWRM(AM) may continue to operate with its licensed daytime power with parameters at variance from licensed values and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits (no change to licensed nighttime operation). It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. MMS must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored by filing a one page letter with the Secretary's office to the attention of supervisory engineer Son Nguyen after BL-20150625ACN has been granted and licensed operations restored.² MMS must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR §1. 1310.

This authority expires on December 21, 2015.
