Dear Licensee:

This is in reference to the request filed September 16, 2015 on behalf of 1TV.com ("1TV"). 1TV previously advised that that KIKO-FM's antenna had been damaged in a snowstorm on December 19, 2012 (see STA BSTA-20130107ABH, granted January 22, 2013). As 1TV indicates in its present request, this station is presently operating with the requested facilities. 1TV believes it had operating authority owing to the filing of several earlier STA requests for continued operation, that appear to have been misfiled as legal STA requests. This STA request is intended to correct this situation.

The request for STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station KIKO-FM may continue to operate with the following facilities:

Antenna height:	
above ground:	50 meters
above mean sea level:	2352 meters

1TV must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored. 1TV must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from radiofrequency exposure in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

¹ Horizontal polarization is standard in the commercial FM service, with vertical polarization permitted up to the horizontally polarized ERP. The replacement antenna must include horizontal polarization at the licensed ERP.

This authority expires on April 19, 2015.

STA Advisory: Section 309(f) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, authorizes the Commission to grant STA in cases of "extraordinary circumstances requiring temporary authorizations in the public interest and when delay in the institution of the temporary operations would seriously prejudice the public interest." However, Section 309(f) is not a means by which a licensee/permittee may circumvent established processing procedures which require the filing of an application, nor is it a means by which a broadcaster may enhance his facility or make operation more convenient for the broadcaster. Stations operating with less than licensed facilities under temporary authorities can be viewed as receiving the benefit of a larger protection area than that in which they are currently providing service.

Accordingly, Special Temporary Authorities by nature are to be temporary and are not intended for extended use. Licensees of stations operating under temporary authorities are reminded that timely restoration of permanent facilities is the responsibility of the licensee and should be undertaken expeditiously. Any request for extension of special temporary authorities carries an increased burden with each subsequent request.

Therefore, requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.
