Special Temporary Authorization

Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed March 7, 2006, on behalf of Henrico County Schools ("HCS"). HCS requests extension of the special temporary authority ("STA") granted on September 15, 2005, to operate Station WHCE with reduced power. In support of the request, HCS states that it is in the process of ordering a new transmitter. Because of the time required for the replacement process, HCS requests extension of STA for the full, statutory term of 180 days.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Our review indicates that the licensee has made progress toward restoration of licensed operation, but additional time is required for completing the work. Thus, extension of STA is warranted.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WHCE may operate with reduced power. HCS must notify the Commission when licensed operation is

restored. HCS must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on **September 28, 2007**.
