Dear Mr. Saurer:

This is in reference to the request filed on April 12, 2016. PNHC requests an extension of the STA granted on October 15, 2015, to operate to operate station WLIE(AM) with parameters at variance due to required replacement of the skirt wire.<sup>1</sup> In support of the request, PNHC states that during the past six months it was unable to complete all work.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

PNHC must submit an e-mail or letter to certify resumption of licensed operations with negligible parameter changes before the expiration date shown below, since we anticipate all work should be completed before that date. Otherwise PNHC must file an FCC Form 302

application to update all operating parameters.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED, and station WLIE(AM) may continue to operate with parameters at variance from licensed values and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. PNHC must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. See 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on November 4, 2016.
