**Informal Objection**

Gentlemen:

This letter refers to the captioned application of Truro Wireless, Inc. ("TRI" or the "Licensee") for renewal of license for Station WCDJ(FM), Truro, Massachusetts. On March 20, 2006, Joshua Levitz ("Levitz") filed an Informal Objection ("Objection") to the application. On September 25, 2006, Levitz filed a request to withdraw the Informal Objection, to which the Licensee filed a Response on February 21, 2007. In the Response, the Licensee's President, Karl Nurse, declares under penalty of perjury that neither TRI nor any of its principals has paid or promised any consideration to Mr. Levitz in connection with the withdrawal of his Objection.

In accordance with longstanding practice, when a petition that raises serious allegations is withdrawn, we consider these matters to ensure that the public interest will be served by grant of those applications.<sup>1</sup> We have reviewed the informal objection and find no reason for the continuation of the issues presented before the agency. Additionally, we have reviewed the Licensee's February 21, 2007, Response, and we find that Mr. Levitz' request for withdrawal of the Objection complies with Section 73.3588 of the Commission's Rules (the "Rules"). Accordingly, we will dismiss the Objection.

Furthermore, pursuant to Section 309(k) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"),<sup>2</sup> we find neither evidence of serious violations of the Act or the Rules nor of other violations



that, when considered together, evidence a pattern of abuse. Further, we find that Station WCDJ(FM) served the public interest, convenience, and necessity during the subject license term. Accordingly, pursuant to Section 309(k) of the Act and Sections 0.61 and 0.283 of the Commission's Rules,<sup>3</sup> the Informal Objection filed by Joshua Levitz IS DISMISSED, and the application (File No. BRH-20051201BPB) of Truro Wireless, Inc. for renewal of the license for station WCDJ(FM), Truro, Massachusetts, IS GRANTED.
