The staff has under consideration the above-captioned application for AM station WHOO(AM) which is currently licensed on 1080 kHz at Kissimmee, Florida. The application proposes to relocate the station to an alternate transmitter site, to change its city of license, change its Class from D to B, to increase its daytime, nighttime and critical hours power, and to change its directional antenna patterns.

Our blanketing interference study shows that the population within the proposed 1 V/m contour exceeds 300 persons and is greater than 1% of the population within the 25 mV/m contour. Based on 2000 U.S. Census population data we show the population within the 1 V/m contour to be 6,888 and the population within the 25 mV/m contour to be 505,051 persons. Thus, the proposal is not in compliance with Section 73.24(g) of the FCC rules and thus must request a waiver.

In addition, our critical hours study of the proposal shows that the maximum radiation toward Class A station KRLD(AM) on 1080 kHz at Dallas, Texas exceeds the permissible radiation along reference azimuth 278° in violation of 47 C.F.R. §73.187(b). According to our study the permissible radiation is 1056.3mV/m @1 km and the proposed radiation is 1079.5 mV/m@1km.

Finally, question 12 of FCC Form 301 needs to be checked Yes as the application is requesting a city of license change.

Please submit a corrective amendment addressing the deficiency described above. Failure to address the deficiency in the pending application within 30 days from the date of this letter may result in dismissal of the application for failure to prosecute under 47 C.F.R. §73.3568(a)(1).
