Dear Counsel,

This letter refers to the above captioned low power television station and application for a digital companion channel. On December 15, 2011, Word Broadcasting Network, Inc. (WBN), filed an informal objection against grant of the application at issue. WBN argued that the station been silent for more than one-year, in violation of Section 312(g) and as of April 29, 2011 its license had automatically expired. An evaluation of Commission records by staff indicates that the Station was never silent for a 12-month consecutive period.<sup>1</sup> WBN does not provide any evidence that contradicts Commission records. WBN also argued that the application was substantively defective. On July 18, 2016, L4 Media Group, LLC requested withdrawal and dismissal of its application for a digital companion channel.<sup>2</sup> The request was subsequently granted by the Video Division. In light of the dismissal of the application WBN's substantive arguments pertaining to the application are moot.

Accordingly, we DENY in part and DISMISS in part the informal objection.
