Update on Tower Registration

Dear Ms. Dortch:

This letter is filed at the request of Susan Crawford in the Audio Division per her letter dated January 11, 2016 regarding the pending application of our client West Jacksonville Baptist Church, Inc. ("WJBC") for its station WJGM(FM) in Baldwin, Florida. Ms. Crawford requested an update no later than 90 days from the date of her letter regarding the efforts to register the proposed antenna structure. WJBC provided that update on April 5, 2016 and requested that the application be held in abeyance until June 9, 2016. An additional update was provided on June 9, 2016, promising a further update by August 8, 2016. This letter provides the promised further update on the WJBC's progress with tower registration.

Notifications to six different Indian tribes has been completed, and we are awaiting responses. Materials including tower drawings and an archeological survey were submitted July 15, 2016 to the Florida Bureau of Historic Preservation (the submission is voluminous, but will be provided upon request). The US Fish & Wildlife Service has responded to WJBC's notice and determined that the proposed tower is not likely to adversely affect resources protected by the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (see attached 7-25-16 letter response).

WJBC will continue to work diligently to resolve this matter and respectfully requests that its application BPH-20151216AEH be held in abeyance a further 60 days through **October 8, 2016** to allow it to do so.

This request is being submitted on behalf of our client, Westside Jacksonville Baptist Church, who plans to construct a replacement telecommunications tower licensed by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). The purpose of this letter is to request information in order to complete an FCC National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Screening.

Westside Jacksonville Baptist Church contracted Martin Environmental Solutions Inc (MartinEnviro) to conduct an FCC NEPA Screening at the above-referenced proposed telecommunications tower site. MartinEnviro respectfully requests your review of the project and your concurrence with our assessment that the proposed project is not likely to adversely affect threatened or endangered species. We would also value your assessment as to whether the tower will be constructed in a critical habitat area or an officially designated wilderness area or wildlife preserve.
