Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to: 1) the request filed April 3, 2007, on behalf of Susquehanna License Co., LLC ("Susquehanna"), for extension of the special temporary authority ("STA") granted October 3, 2006, to operate Station WGLD with emergency antenna facilities; 2) a similar request filed on June 18, 2007; and 3) counsel's letter of June 22, 2007, which notes the duplicate filings and withdraws the second request.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- · Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond
 the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve
 the problem.

Our review indicates that Application BP-20070119AEA remains pending; thus, the licensee has been prevented from restoring licensed operation due to causes beyond its control and has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the April 3, 2007, request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED, and the duplicate request filed June 18, 2007, IS DISMISSED at the request of the applicant. Station WGLD may continue to operate with an emergency, long wire antenna. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. Susquehanna must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio

frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310. This authority expires on **February 16, 2008**.
