Dear Licensee:

This is with respect to the Petition for Reconsideration filed by Miriam Media, Inc. (MMI), seeking reconsideration and reinstatement of the above-referenced application. For the reasons below, we grant the Petition and reinstate the above-referenced application for construction of a new digital low power television ("LPTV") station.

On August 25, 2016, the Video Division dismissed the above referenced application because the Mexican Department of Communications (MDC) informed the Commission that it would object to the grant of the proposed application as it would not provide protection to digital channel 24, Mexicali, Baja California.¹ The Commission has since been informed by the MDC that they have accepted MMI's proposed digital LPTV facility on channel 24 in Palm Springs, CA.²

Based on the facts and circumstances, we find that reinstatement of the LPTV construction permit application is appropriate and would be in furtherance of the public interest.

Accordingly, the Petition for Reconsideration filed by MMI **IS GRANTED** and the application **IS REINSTATED**.
