The Akiachak School in Akiachak, Alaska applied for a Class D Broadcast License with the FCC on April 18th, 2007. The school will be offering a Broadcasting and Media class this year. One of the requirements of the class will be to set up and operate an FM radio station from within the school. The station will be using 92.7 as the broadcast frequency, operating at 50 watts, and using the proposed call letters KHKY (Radio Husky). The school's FM station will serve the community of Akiachak, and the signal may also reach nearby villages such as Bethel, Akiak, Kwethluk, etc. This station will provide music, community announcements, historical facts, and interviews with Elders all pertaining to Akiachak's history and community activities.
