The KSIZ license has three frequencies. 102.3 is the only frequency which is non operable. 101.7 and 99.3 continue to operate. The vast majority of our coverage map is served by these two frequencies. We need safe conditions on Mt Shasta to repair the tower which was damaged in the storm. The snow is 20 feet deep up there. The middle of June will be our first opportunity to take a crew and equipment to the site to safely effect repairs. We will have 102.3 operational as soon as it is safe to do so, however, KSIZ is on the air and continues to operate and continues to serve the majority of our coverage area in the interim.
