STANDARD BROADCAST STATION LICENSE

Subject to the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, subsequent Acts, and Treaties, and Commission Rules made thereunder, and further subject to conditions set forth in this license, the LICENSEE

CENTRAL TEXAS COMMUNICATIONS, INC.

is hereby authorized to use and operate the radio transmitting apparatus hereinafter described for the purpose of broadcasting for the term ending 3 a.m. Local Time AUGUST 1, 1983

The licensee shall use and operate said apparatus only in accordance with the following terms:

ANTENNA: 150' overall height, uniform cross-section, guyed, shunt-excited vertical radiator with a communications type antenna side-mounted near the top. Theoretical efficiency 169 mV/m/kW. Ground system consists of 120 equally spaced, buried copper radials 150 feet in length plus 120 interspaced radials 50 feet in length, all radials bonded to the base of the tower.

9. Transmitter(s): TYPE ACCEPTED
10. Conditions: Licensee shall accept such interference as may be imposed by other existing 250 watt Class IV stations in the event they are subsequently authorized to increase power to 1,000 watts.

The Commission reserves the right during said license period of terminating this license or making effective any changes or modification of this license which may be necessary to comply with any decision of the Commission rendered as a result of any hearing held under the rules of the Commission prior to the commencement of this license period or any decision rendered as a result of any such hearing which has been designated but not held, prior to the commencement of this license period.

This license is issued on the licensee's representation that the statements contained in licensee's application are true and that the undertakings therein contained so far as they are consistent herewith, will be carried out in good faith. The licensee shall, during the term of this license, render such broadcasting service as will serve public interest, convenience, or necessity to the full extent of the privileges herein conferred.

This license shall not vest in the licensee any right to operate the station nor any right in the use of the frequency designated in the license beyond the term hereof, nor in any other manner than authorized herein. Neither the license nor the right granted hereunder shall be assigned or otherwise transferred in violation of the Communications Act of 1934. This license is subject to the right of use or control by the Government of the United States conferred by Section 506 of the Communications Act of 1934.
