Dear Applicant:

This is in reference to the request filed October 6, 2017, on behalf of Forks Broadcasting, Inc. ("FBI"). FBI requests special temporary authority ("STA") to operate station KFKB(AM) with a temporary long-wire antenna from an alternate site location.<sup>1</sup> Station KFKB(AM) has lost the lease for the station's licensed antenna site. The station has been silent since December 10, 2016 and is therefore requesting an STA to commence broadcast operations before 12:01 a.m., December 11, 2017 or its license will expire as a matter of law.

In support of the request, FBI states that KFKB(AM) proposes operation from an alternate site using a temporary 31 meter long-wire antenna and with a reduced power of 250 watts. The long-wire antenna will be supported by a communications tower and a 110 foot Douglas Fir tree and mounted 10 meters above ground level. The proposed site is located 0.4 mile (0.6 kilometer) from the licensed KFKB(AM) site.

STA requests which involve a change in transmitter site must include four critical elements: (1) Loss of the licensed site must be beyond the licensee's control; (2) STA facilities must continue to provide service to the licensed community; (3) STA facilities must maintain, as closely as practicable, the licensed service area<sup>2</sup> without extending it; (4) STA facilities cannot involve the construction of towers intended for permanent use by the station requesting the STA.

Accordingly, the request for STA is GRANTED. Station KFKB(AM) may operate with the following facilities:

47° 57′ 15″ N, 124° 22′ 51″ W (NAD 1927) 1490 KHz Unlimited Not to exceed 250 watts Long-wire antenna (31 meters in length) mounted 10 meters above the ground

It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. KFKB(AM) must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored. KFKB(AM) must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on April 17, 2018.

Notwithstanding the grant of this STA or the expiration date specified herein, the station's license will expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m., December 11, 2017. *See* Pub. Law No. 104-104, 110 Stat. 56, Section 403(1)(1996) and *Order, Silent Station Authorizations*, FCC 96-218 (released May 17, 1996). *See also Public Notice*, Expedited Processing of Applications Filed by Silent Stations, DA 96-818 (May 22,1996). The licensee must notify the Audio Division immediately upon resumption of broadcasting.

**STA Advisory:** Section 309(f) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, authorizes the Commission to grant STA in cases of "extraordinary circumstances requiring temporary authorizations in the public interest and when delay in the institution of the temporary operations would seriously prejudice the public interest." However, Section 309(f) is not a means by which a licensee/permittee may circumvent established processing procedures which require the filing of an application, nor is it a means by which a broadcaster may enhance his facility or make operation more convenient for the broadcaster. Stations operating with less than licensed facilities under temporary authorities can be viewed as receiving the benefit of a larger protection area than that in which they are currently providing service.

Accordingly, Special Temporary Authorities by nature are to be temporary and are not intended for extended use. Licensees of stations operating under temporary authorities are reminded that timely restoration of permanent facilities is the responsibility of the licensee and should be undertaken expeditiously. Any request for extension of special temporary authorities carries an increased burden with each subsequent request.

Therefore, requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

• Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;

- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.
