The transmitter specified has not been type accepted. Accordingly, before program tests will be authorized, the transmitter must be type accepted in accordance with the requirements of Section 73.640 of the Commission's Rules.

Subject to the condition that prior to issuance of program tests authority for the construction authorized herein, the permittee shall file with the Commission a partial proof of performance, as defined by Section 73.154(a) of the Commission's Rules on standard broadcast station W T G R, Myrtle Beach, South Carolina made both before commencement and after completion of the construction of the antenna structure specified herein, to satisfactorily demonstrate that the ~~ant~~ radiation pattern has not changed because of said construction.

These measurements shall be submitted in tabulated form. Also, measurement data shall be certified by all parties involved before submission to the Commission. The engineer selected by the permittee to make the measurements shall be acceptable to all parties, and the cost of making the measurements, and any corrective measures that may be required to restore the patterns to the conditions prior to this construction shall be borne by the permittee herein. Also, permittee shall be responsible for maintenance and repair of any detuning circuits installed on the antenna supporting structure of the TV station proposed herein which are necessary to restore the radiation pattern of station W T G R.

Ltr. 8-30-79 from Richard Shiben to King Communications, Inc.:

This refers to the above-captioned application for an extension of time within which to construct Station WGSE(TV).

The Commission's records show that the application for a construction permit to build Station WGSE(TV) was granted November 23, 1977, with construction to be completed by May 23, 1979.

Your present application indicates that no progress has been made toward construction and that equipment has not been ordered. Your reason is that you expected to obtain a network affiliation which you have not yet received.

In effect, you are now informing the Commission that you will not construct the station unless you obtain a network affiliation, a representation which you did not make to the Commission in your application for a construction permit. It appears, therefore, that your failure to construct is due to conditions wholly within your control and no other reason appears which would justify grant of your request. Accordingly, you are advised that, pursuant to Section 319(b) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Section 73.3534(a) of the Commission's Rules, your application IS DISMISSED, the construction permit for Station WGSE(TV) IS CANCELLED, and the call letters ARE DELETED. Should you desire a hearing on your application, you may request reinstatement, by letter submitted no later than thirty days from the date of receipt of this letter. In the event that you request reinstatement, your application will be set for oral argument before the Commission's Review Board.

BC 01999, ADOPTED NOVEMBER 13, 1980, RELEASED NOVEMBER 28, 1980; BY DELEGATED AUTHORITY: APPLICANT'S APRIL 21, 1980 modification application represented its effort to comply with the Review Board's requirement that it file for a minor modification which would not require a hearing and that it inaugurate service as rapidly as possible. It appears, however, that in order to avoid non-compliance with the Rules, a major change was necessary. Applicant has {see next card no.3}.

About the History Cards ...

History Cards were first used by the Department of Commerce to keep track of applications filed by, and changes to, the earliest AM broadcast radio stations in the early 1920s. The records were subsequently transferred to the Federal Radio Commission in 1927, and after that to the Federal Communications Commission when that agency was created in 1934. These cards gradually grew into a large card file.

TV History Cards were initiated in the early 1940s, with the authorization of the earliest TV stations. History Cards remained in use until the creation of the first computerized database in 1980 to track broadcast applications, the Broadcast Application Processing System (BAPS). However, the Commission did not transfer the data from the History Cards to the new system. Instead, it retained the History Cards in their original form for reference.

In 1999, the Commission moved to a new location (445 12th Street SW), and also at that time created the successor database to BAPS, the Consolidated DataBase System (CDBS). Prior to that move, the History Cards were transferred to microfiche by a contractor (only a few sets of microfiche exist), and the original paper cards were destroyed. The History Cards were stored on the microfiche as negative images, like those you see above.

History Cards contain very brief entries and notes about station facilities, applications, and ownership. They are not, and never were intended to be, a comprehensive record of a station's operations. Nevertheless, they can be useful to help determine, for example, when a station first went on the air and its call letters at that time. History Card comments were generally typed onto the cards, and thus some records will show more faintly or with more smudging than others, depending on the quality of typewriter and ribbon then used. Occasional handwritten comments, corrections, and strikeouts may also be found. Cards may be incomplete, missing, or occasionally out of sequence.

The History Cards are presented here as they were copied to microfiche, to preserve this record for public use, and with the hope that they will be of value to future researchers of television station history.
