COMMISSION STAYS ORDER ASSIGNING CHANNEL 13, ROCHESTER, N.Y. TO FLOWER CITY TV CORP.; TO WEIGH PETITIONS FOR RECONSIDERATION

Motions to stay the assignment of a construction permit, to Flower City Television Corporation, for a television station on Channel 13, Rochester, N.Y., have been granted by the Federal Communications Commission. The assignment will be stayed until the petitions filed for reconsideration have been studied.

The request for the stay was filed by Community Broadcasting, Inc., Main Broadcast Company, Inc., The Federal Broadcasting System, Inc., and Citizens Television Corp. All were applicants for the CP for Channel 13.

In support of the stay request, the petitioners pointed out that service is now being provided for the Rochester area by an interim corporation operation of Channel 13 and that "serious questions" have been raised in the petitions for reconsideration. If the stay is not granted and the decision should be vacated or reversed it would be extremely difficult to reconstitute the interim operation without impairment of service to the public, they stated.

In granting the request the Commission noted that the public interest would be "better served by grant of a stay of our Decision until we have an opportunity to fully consider and resolve the questions raised by the petitions for reconsideration..."

The Commission granted the Flower City application on August 3, 1967. The motions for stay were filed on September 5, 1967. The proceeding (Dockets 14394 etc.) involves nine mutually exclusive applications for construction permits for Channel 13.

ACTION IN DOCKET CASE

TV CHANNEL 13, ROCHESTER, NEW YORK, STAY OF GRANT DENIED

The Commission has denied a motion for stay pending judicial review of its grant of TV Channel 13 to Flower City Television Corporation of Rochester, New York, but if petitioners file a request for stay of the decision with the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia on or before January 19, 1968, the Commission stated it will stay the proceeding until judicial determination has been made on that request (Dockets 14394-5, 14460-2, 14464-8).

The motion for stay was filed with the Commission by Genesee Valley Television Co., Inc., Star Television, Inc., Community Broadcasting, Inc., Heritage Radio and Television Broadcasting System, Inc., Main Broadcast Co., Inc., The Federal Broadcasting System, Inc., Citizens Television Corp., and Rochester Telecasters, Inc.

The petitioners said that appeals from the Commission decision will be filed, and that there would be "enormous difficulties" in reconstituting the interim operation of Channel 13 if a stay were denied and the Commission decision ultimately reversed.

The Commission said, however, "...the mere pendency of judicial appeals is not considered sufficient justification for grant of a stay, since Flower City has been determined to be the best applicant and since the public interest will be best served by the commencement of service by Flower City at the earliest possible time.... The Commission is confident that arrangements can be made for the continuation of the existing service if its Decision is ultimately reversed...."

This proceeding involves nine competing applications for construction permits for a new television station on Channel 13. The Commission granted the application of Flower City in a decision of August 3, 1967. It granted a stay of the decision on September 18, 1967, in response to petitions for reconsideration, and denied the petitions for reconsideration in a Memorandum Opinion and Order of November 29, 1967.

2. Noting that appeals have or will be filed with respect to the Commission's Decision in this proceeding, petitioners contend that justice requires and that good cause exists for stay of that Decision pending judicial review. In view of the interim operation of the proposed television station, petitioners assert that there will be no delay of or disruption in the service to the public as a result of such a stay, but that there would be enormous difficulties in reconstituting that interim

1/ On January 2, 1968, the petitioners filed a revised page 12 of their motion for stay to correct the inadvertent omission of the name of one of the parties to the motion. In addition, on January 4, 1968, the petitioners filed a supplement to their motion for stay consisting of an affidavit in support of certain statements of fact in the motion. On January 3, 1968, Flower City Television Corporation filed an opposition. operation if a stay were denied and if the Commission's Decision were ultimately reversed. Since petitioners believe that there is a substantial likelihood that the Commission's Decision will be reversed, they conclude that a stay is required to prevent irreparable injury to the public and to themselves.

3. While a stay was issued (FCC 67-1048, released September 18, 1967) until this administrative proceeding could be concluded and a regular authorization could be issued after full consideration of the petitions for reconsideration of the Commission's Decision, this administrative proceeding was in fact concluded by the Commission's Memorandum Opinion and Order denying those petitions for reconsideration, FCC 67-1276, released November 29, 1967. In view of this circumstance the mere pendency of judicial appeals is not considered sufficient justification for grant of a stay, since Flower City has been determined to be the best applicant and since the public interest will be best served by the commencement of service by Flower City at the earliest possible time. See Grand Broadcasting Company, FCC 64-1132, released December 10, 1964, 4 RR 2d 205. The Commission is confident that arrangements can be made for the continuation of the existing service if its Decision is ultimately reversed, and, thus, petitioners' motion for stay pending judicial review must be denied. However, it would be consistent with the orderly disposition of the Commission's business and in deference to the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit to stay this proceeding for a brief period to permit the petitioners to file a request for a stay with the Court of Appeals, if they should desire to do so, and to permit the Court to make a determination with respect to that request.

4. ACCORDINGLY, IT IS ORDERED:

- (a) That the motion for stay pending judicial review, filed December 27, 1967, by petitioners IS DENIED, and
- (b) That, if petitioners file a request for stay of the Decision (FCC 67-924, 9 FCC 2d 249) in this proceeding with the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia on or before January 19, 1968, the Decision herein SHALL BE STAYED until judicial determination of that request.

About the History Cards ...

History Cards were first used by the Department of Commerce to keep track of applications filed by, and changes to, the earliest AM broadcast radio stations in the early 1920s. The records were subsequently transferred to the Federal Radio Commission in 1927, and after that to the Federal Communications Commission when that agency was created in 1934. These cards gradually grew into a large card file.

TV History Cards were initiated in the early 1940s, with the authorization of the earliest TV stations. History Cards remained in use until the creation of the first computerized database in 1980 to track broadcast applications, the Broadcast Application Processing System (BAPS). However, the Commission did not transfer the data from the History Cards to the new system. Instead, it retained the History Cards in their original form for reference.

In 1999, the Commission moved to a new location (445 12th Street SW), and also at that time created the successor database to BAPS, the Consolidated DataBase System (CDBS). Prior to that move, the History Cards were transferred to microfiche by a contractor (only a few sets of microfiche exist), and the original paper cards were destroyed. The History Cards were stored on the microfiche as negative images, like those you see above.

History Cards contain very brief entries and notes about station facilities, applications, and ownership. They are not, and never were intended to be, a comprehensive record of a station's operations. Nevertheless, they can be useful to help determine, for example, when a station first went on the air and its call letters at that time. History Card comments were generally typed onto the cards, and thus some records will show more faintly or with more smudging than others, depending on the quality of typewriter and ribbon then used. Occasional handwritten comments, corrections, and strikeouts may also be found. Cards may be incomplete, missing, or occasionally out of sequence.

The History Cards are presented here as they were copied to microfiche, to preserve this record for public use, and with the hope that they will be of value to future researchers of television station history.
