Request for Special Temporary Authority to Remain Silent

Dear Mr. McCormick:

This letter concerns the request you filed on September 13, 2018, on behalf of Cumberland University (CU), for Special Temporary Authority (STA) to permit FM Radio Station WFMQ to remain silent.

CU's request states that Station WFMQ(FM) went silent on December 20, 2017, pending the proposed assignment of its license. The request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

CU's request is granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station WFMQ(FM) to remain silent not to exceed 180 days from the date of this letter. Notwithstanding the grant of this Special Temporary Authority, the broadcast license for Station WFMQ(FM) will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not resume by 12:01 a.m., December 21, 2018.<sup>1</sup>

CU is required to notify the Commission when broadcast operations resume. If CU does not file the notification of resumption of operations in a timely manner, the license may be subject to cancellation pursuant to Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, as amended.<sup>2</sup>

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. It is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed.<sup>3</sup>

Finally, Section 73.1740(a)(4) of the Commission's Rules permits licensees to temporarily discontinue operations for good cause, and for a period not to exceed 30 days without further authority.<sup>4</sup> This rule requires that the licensee notify the Commission by letter not later than the 10<sup>th</sup> day of limited or discontinued operations, and requires a licensee to seek Commission authorization for any period of limited or discontinued operations exceeding 30 days. CU failed to submit a timely request for an STA to permit Station WFMQ(FM) to remain silent beyond January 20, 2018, and the action taken herein shall
