> Request for Extension of Special Temporary Authority to Remain Silent

Dear Ms. Sashkin:

This letter concerns the request you filed on September 18, 2018, on behalf of International Broadcasting Corporation (IBC), for extension of Special Temporary Authority (STA) to permit Radio Station WRSJ(AM) to remain silent.<sup>1</sup>

Commission records reflect that IBC stated that Station WRSJ(AM) went silent on September 20, 2017, for technical reasons. The previous STA was granted on October 24, 2017, and expired on April 22, 2018. IBC requests extension of its STA for continuing technical reasons. The request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

IBC's request is granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station WRSJ(AM) to remain silent until March 6, 2019. Notwithstanding the grant of this Special Temporary Authority, the broadcast license for Station WRSJ(AM) will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m., March 7, 2019.<sup>2</sup>

IBC is required to notify the Commission when broadcast operations resume. If IBC does not file the notification of resumption of operations in a timely manner, the license may be subject to cancellation pursuant to Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, as amended.<sup>3</sup>

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. We note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed.<sup>4</sup>
