Dear Ms. Williams:

Greetings. My name is Melba Y. Smith and I am the Director of Radio & Television Services for WRVSFM/HD, 89.9 and W18BB-DTV licensed to Elizabeth City State University in Elizabeth City, North Carolina. On December 1, 2017, a Silent FM Station notification letter was emailed to your attention and a certified copy of WRVS's Silent FM Station notification letter was also mailed. On November 22, 2017 at approximately 21:00 WRVS-FM went silent due to unforeseen equipment failure at the station's transmitter site. After several days of troubleshooting and consultation from professional engineers, it was determined that RF module failure and burnout of the transmitter's motherboard were contributing factors to the station's off air status. On Sunday, December 3, 2017 at approximately 17:25, WRVS returned to air at a low power operation of 615 watts. Pursuant to the Electronic Code of Federal Regulations, Section 73.1635 (47 CFR 73.1635 and Emergency Antennas, Silent Stations, Special Temporary Authority (STA) for Broadcast Services), "A special temporary authorization (STA) is the authority granted to a permittee or licensee to permit the operation of a broadcast facility for a limited period at a specified variance from the terms of the station authorization or requirements of the FCC rules applicable to the particular class of station." Please allow this letter to serve as an official request for Special Temporary Authority for WRVS, 89.9FM to remain servicing its listening public in low power operation until full restoration. To date, we have received the equipment for installation and have remained in regular contact with Rick Voepel at Broadcast Electronics and anticipate a January scheduling date for site repair and equipment installation with full power restoration expected within the next 45 days. Elizabeth City State University has approved the contractual service from BE and we now await the issuance of a purchase order.
