Dear Mr. Neely:

On March 18, 2019, we received your request on behalf of Voice of International Christian Evangelism, Inc. (VICE), for tolling of the construction deadline for the construction permit (CP) for FM Translator Station K263CC, Heber, California, Fac. ID No. 202104 (Station), granted on October 5, 2018, for a three-year term, expiring on October 5, 2021. The CP grant is conditioned on receiving concurrence from the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) for the use of the Station's channel. This request falls within one of the criteria for tolling, and **IS GRANTED**.¹

Grant of the request is subject to the following conditions:

Tolling is effective as of February 16, 2019.² When tolling ends, 2 years, 7 months, 18 days will remain on the permit.

Tolling will remain in effect for 6 months, until September 18, 2019, absent earlier resolution of the condition. If the matter is not resolved within 6 months, VICE must file a status report by September 18, 2019, and at six-month intervals thereafter, requesting continued tolling treatment.

VICE also must notify us within 30 days of the condition being resolved. These status reports must be sent by letter to Marlene S. Dortch, Secretary, FCC, 445 12 St, S.W., Washington, D.C. 20554 with a courtesy copy by e-mail to Victoria McCauley at Victoria.McCauley@fcc.gov.

 $^{^{2}}$ Pursuant to 373.3598(c) of the rules, because the request was filed more than 30 days from the date that the tolling event occurred (grant of the application), we look back 30 days from the date of filing to determine the effective date of tolling.

When tolling ends (either because VICE has not filed a request for continued tolling or because the matter has been resolved) we will calculate a new CP expiration date by adding the remaining 2 years, 7 months, 18 days.
