Operational Status Inquiry

Dear Licensee:

We have two pending requests for Special Temporary Authority to remain silent (STA) filed on December 12, 2017 and on March 19, 2019 on behalf of Centro Cristiano De Vida Eterna (CCVE), licensee of Station W252AW, Chicago, Illinois (Station). We also have several informal pleadings filed by Larry Langford, Jr. (Langford), stating that the Station has not been constructed in accordance with its authorization.¹ To date, CCVE has not filed a response to Mr. Langford's allegations. Pursuant to Section 73.1740 of the Commission's Rules,² CCVE is required to clarify this matter in writing within thirty days of the date of this letter.

Langford argues that CCVE has falsely certified that the station was constructed and ready for operation in its applications for licenses to cover construction permits³ and falsely claimed on a silent STA that the reason for silence was that it had transmitter trouble⁴ when the Station had not been constructed. CCVE's only response to any of Langford's objections was to request dismissal of its application for license to cover in File No. BLFT-20170419AII.

Based on this information, we believe that sufficient question has been raised regarding the Station's construction and operation to open an inquiry into the matter. It appears that the Station may not have been constructed in accordance with its authorization and may have been silent (or failed to operate with authorized facilities) in violation of our rules and the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (Act) for more than one year. Pursuant to Section 312(g) of the Act, if a broadcast station fails to transmit broadcast signals with its authorized facilities for any consecutive 12-month period, then the station license granted for the operation of that broadcast station expires at the end of that period, unless extended or reinstated by Commission action.⁵

Please provide evidence documenting the Station's construction and operational status since March 4, 2018. This evidence must indicate the location, effective radiated power and antenna height above ground level for all periods of operation from April 5, 2016,⁶ to the present. Also include copies of all leases, contracts to install equipment, agreements for utility installation, insurance records, personnel records (including payroll records appropriately redacted to protect the privacy of individual employees), engineering records, and station logs, for that period of time. In addition, you must provide copies of all invoices, bills, checks written or received, credit card charges, wire transfers or deposits of funds relating to the Station's construction and operation.⁷ You must also include pictures of the Station's transmission facilities during this timeframe, and provide exact Station coordinates.

Failure to respond to this letter within the specified time will result in adverse actions jeopardizing both the Station's license and call letters.
