I am sorry for the delay. The client spent over \$130,000 for the necessary FAA study, environmental study, historical study, building permits, architectural plans, etc. The Allamakee Planning and Zoning Commission messed up by putting the wrong date for the initial hearing and the local building permits per granted. When the neighbors found out about the grant, they were outraged and were sure that P & Z and Wennes Communications were trying to sneak the tower in without their consent.
