Dear Mr. Martinez:

This is in reference to the request filed on July 5, 2019. RVCM requests a further extension of the STA granted on November 13, 2007, to continue operating with a long wire antenna at the construction permit site to allow time to install the transmitter and file the required FCC Form 302 application. In support of the request, RVCM stated that it plans to install the transmitter very soon, and that the antenna, ground system, and transmitter building have already been completed.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the request for extension of the STA IS HEREBY GRANTED, and RVCM

may continue to operate on 1580 kHz with a 30 foot long wire antenna using a maximum of 0.5 kW day, and 0.005 kW at night. RVCM must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. See 47 CFR §1.1310.

This authority expires on January 25, 2020.
