Dear Applicant:

This letter concerns minor change application BPH-20171019ABB (Application) submitted by Radio One Licenses, LLC (Radio One), licensee of FM station KROI(FM), Seabrook, Texas, proposing modification of the licensed KROI transmitting facilities.<sup>1</sup>

Pursuant to Section 17.4(a) of the Commission's Rules,<sup>2</sup> any proposed construction of a new antenna structure or proposed alteration of an existing antenna structure that requires Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) notification also requires registration with the Commission prior to construction or alteration. Our records indicate that the proposed antenna structure has not been registered. FCC antenna structure registration may be accomplished electronically via the Internet at <http://wireless.fcc.gov/antenna/>.

Following FCC registration of the antenna structure, a curative amendment to the Application, which includes the FCC Antenna Structure Registration Number (ASRN), must be submitted to the Commission. If the antenna structure cannot be registered with the Commission within 90 days of the date of this letter, Radio One must notify the Commission, in writing, concerning the delay.<sup>3</sup> In the event that further difficulties with the registration process occur following Radio One's initial response to



this letter, Radio One must provide the Commission with written updates concerning the structure registration process every 60 days thereafter.<sup>4</sup>

Further action on the Application will be withheld for a period of 90 days from the date of this letter to provide Radio One an opportunity to respond. Failure to respond within this time period or to provide written updates as required will result in the dismissal of the Application pursuant to Section 73.3568(a)(1) of the Commission's Rules.<sup>5</sup>
