Dear Mr. Holland:

This is in reference to the request filed on October 21, 2019. FRC requests a further extension of the STA granted on March 31, 2017, to continue operating from an alternate site to allow time to file the required FCC Form 301 application (due to loss of the licensed site in 2017). In support of the request, FRC stated that it plans to file the application in the upcoming months.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the request for extension of the STA is hereby GRANTED, and FRC may continue to operate with the following facilities:
