Dear Mr. Patterson:

This is in reference to the request filed on October 21, 2019. MSB requests an extension of the STA granted on February 3, 2017, to continue operating from an alternate site to allow time to file the required FCC Form 302 license application to cover BP-20190725AAC.<sup>1</sup> In support of the request, MSB stated that additional time is needed to file the application.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA is hereby GRANTED, and MSB may continue to operate with the following facilities:

MSB must reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received, and use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47CFR 1.1310.

This authority expires on April 3, 2020.
