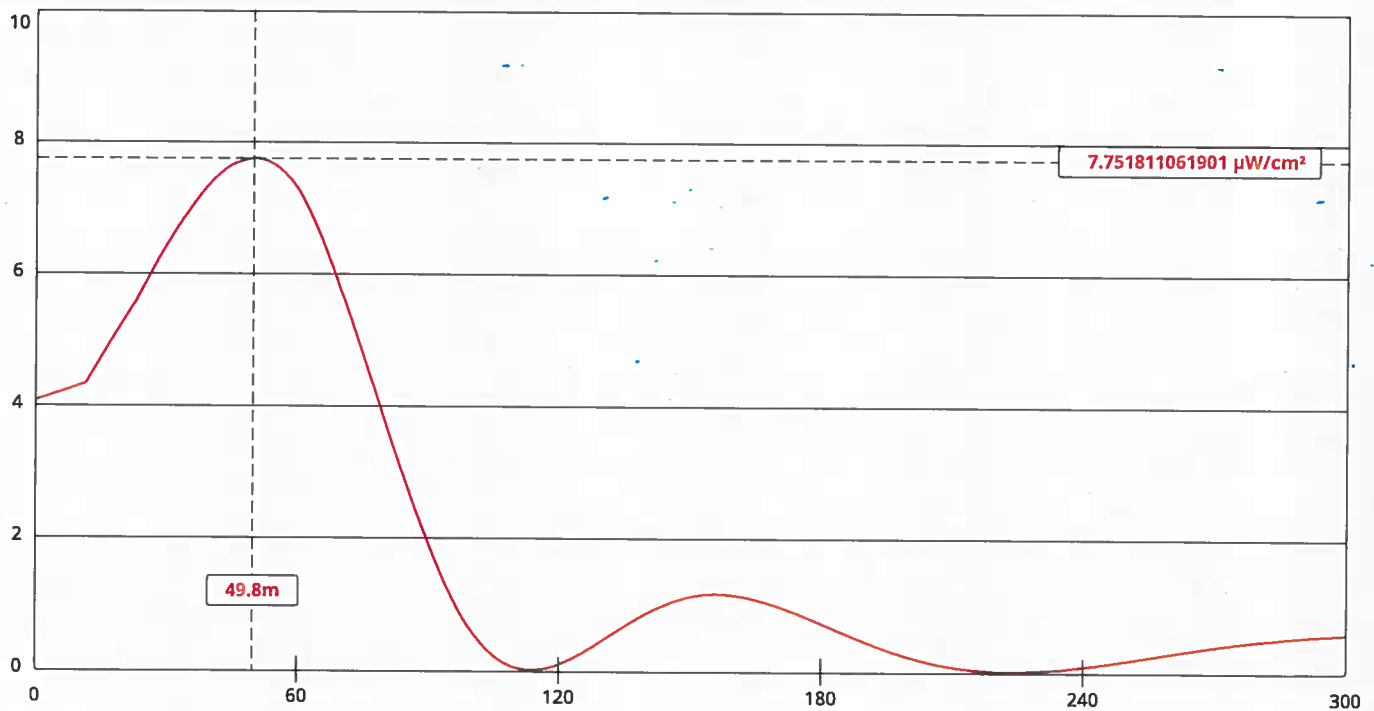

Kizart Media Partners ("Kizart"), tentative selectee for a new FM station at Cleveland, Mississippi, submits this statement in support of its amendment to the pending application to change the city of license to Shaw, Mississippi under Priority 3¹. Kizart will demonstrate, pursuant to Section 307(b) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. § 307(b), that the proposed city of license change is in the public interest pursuant to *Revision of Procedures Governing Amendments to FM Table of Allotments and Changes of Community of License in the Radio Broadcast Services*, 21 FCC Rcd 14212, ¶ 10 (2006) and *Policies to Promote Rural Radio Service and to Streamline Allotment and Assignment Procedures*, 26 FCC Rcd 2556 (2011), *recon.* 27 FCC Rcd 12829 (2012) ("*Rural Radio*").

As demonstrated in the Engineering Statement, Channel 226C2 can be re-allotted to Shaw consistent with Section 73.207 of the Commission's Rules. See Engineering Exhibit E1. The proposed application site also complies with the spacing rule. See Engineering Exhibit E1. A 70 dBu signal will be provided to Shaw from the proposed allotment and application sites. See Eng. Exhibits E2 and E3.

Shaw (pop. 1,952--2010 US Census) is an incorporated community with no local service. There is an Elementary School, High School and Post Office.

¹ *Revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures*, 90 FCC 2d 88 (1982).

In *Amendment of the Commission's Rules Regarding Modification of FM and TV Authorizations to Specify a New Community of License*, 4 FCC Red 4870 (1989), *recons. granted in part*, 5 FCC Rcd 7094 (1990) ("*Community of License Order*") as modified by the *Rural Radio* decision, the Commission stated that a station may change its community of license without subjecting the license to other expressions of interest if: (1) the proposed allotment is mutually exclusive with the current allotment; (2) the current community of license will not be deprived of its only local service; and (3) the proposed arrangement of allotments is preferred under the Commission's allotment priorities. These criteria are met here.

First, the vacant allotment of Channel 226C2 at Cleveland is mutually exclusive with the proposed allotment of Channel 226C3 at Shaw. See Exhibit E1 of the Engineering Statement.


Second, Cleveland, Mississippi will not be deprived of local service because there are currently 2 FM stations and 1 AM station licensed to Cleveland, Mississippi.

Third, the proposal satisfies Priority 3 because Shaw will be provided its first local broadcast service. See *Revision of FM Assignment Policies and Procedures*, 90 FCC 2d 88 (1982).² Shaw has all of the attributes of a community deserving of a first local service. See Exhibit 1.

In conclusion, Kizart's proposal satisfies the Commission's Section 307(b) policies and should be granted.

² The FCC's FM allotment priorities are as follows: (1) first full-time aural service, (2) second full-time aural service, (3) first local service, and (4) other public interest matters.
