Dear Mr. Benedict:

This is in reference to the request filed November 27, 2007, on behalf of CBS Radio East, Inc. ("CBS"). CBS requests extension of the special temporary authority ("STA") granted on September 7, 2007, to operate Station KDKA with reduced power.¹ In support of the request, CBS states that the station continues to experience problems with its antenna system and that its engineers are working to determine and resolve the problem.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Our review indicates that the licensee has been prevented from restoring licensed operation due to causes beyond its control and has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem. Thus, extension of STA is warranted.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station KDKA may continue to operate with reduced power. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease

operation if complaints of interference are received. CBS must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.² CBS must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on **December 27, 2008**.
