Operational Status Inquiry

Dear Licensee:

It has come to our attention that Station WQLU(FM), Lynchburg, Virginia (Station), licensed to Liberty University, Inc (LU), may be operating with unauthorized facilities. Pursuant to Section 73.1740 of the Commission's Rules, LU is required to clarify this matter in writing within 30 days of the date of this letter.

Our records show that on September 6, 2011, LU filed a request for Special Temporary Authority (STA) stating the following:

The applicant seeks to relocate the WWMC antenna location due to a lease-related dispute with the owner of the currently-licensed [sic] tower location. As a result, the tower supporting the licensed facility will be dismantled on or before September 30, 2011. WWMC must be moved on or before that date in order to remain on the air.<sup>1</sup>

Similar justifications were attached to STA requests filed on March 12, 2012<sup>2</sup>, September 4, 2012<sup>3</sup>, and March 6, 2013.<sup>4</sup>

After the March 6, 2013 STA expired, it appears that the Station had no authority to operate from September 10, 2013 until November 24, 2014, when a new STA, filed on November 13, 2014, was granted. In that STA, LU stated:

The tower supporting the licensed facility was dismantled on on [sic]September 27, 2011. WWMC was relocated pursuant to a Special Temporary Authority issued by the FCC. (See BSTA-20110906AAN.) This application seeks reinstatement of that STA, with no changes to the technical facilities it specifies.<sup>5</sup>

That STA was granted on November 24, 2014, and expired on May 25, 2015.

On August 19, 2020, another request for STA was filed, proposing to use the same facilities at the same temporary site as requested in the 6 previous STAs.<sup>6</sup> In that STA LU states:

The applicant is the owner of a registered communications tower at the proposed coordinates and the STA facility will be located on that tower in order to continue operations of WQLU pending relocation to a new permanent site.

This STA remains pending. We note that LU has not filed any application for construction permit for a new site or a notice of resumption of operation using the licensed facilities for the Station during the intervening 5 years since the last STA's expiration.

Based on this information, it appears that the Station failed to operate with authorized facilities for more than one year. Pursuant to Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, as amended, **if a broadcast station fails to transmit broadcast signals with its authorized facilities for any consecutive 12-month period, then the station license granted for the operation of that broadcast station expires at the end of that period, unless extended or reinstated by Commission action.**<sup>7</sup>

Starting on November 24, 2014 through the present, please indicate the dates on which the Station operated from (a) the licensed site, (b) the STA site, or (c) another site, and provide the following evidence for each location. First, it must indicate the exact Station coordinates, effective radiated power and antenna height above ground level at each location. Second, it must include copies of all leases for that period of time, and finally, it **must include pictures** of the Station's studio facilities and transmission facilities at each location during this timeframe, if available.

We also note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the Station's tower shall be maintained.<sup>8</sup>

Your response must be addressed to Marlene S. Failure to respond to this letter within the specified time will result in adverse actions jeopardizing both the
