Dear Mr. Trent:

This letter concerns the request you filed on June 3, 2021, on behalf of RadioJones, LLC (RadioJones), for Special Temporary Authority (STA) to permit FM Translator Station W259AK to remain silent.

RadioJones's request states that Station W259AK went silent on June 3, 2021, because it lost its programming source.

RadioJones's request is granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station W259AK to remain silent not to exceed 180 days from the date of this letter. Notwithstanding the grant of this Special Temporary Authority, the broadcast license for Station W259AK will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not resume by 12:01 a.m., June 4, 2022.

RadioJones is required to notify the Commission when broadcast operations resume. If RadioJones does not file the notification of resumption of operations in a timely manner, the license may be subject to cancellation pursuant to section 312(g) of the Communications Act, as amended.²

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. It is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed.³
